MANAGEMENT IN SPORT

BA study programme



Kranj is a picturesque town situated on the junction of important routes, leading from Northern Europe to the Adriatic Sea and from Western towards Eastern Europe.

The old town centre is rich with cultural-historical sights. Therefore, it has been protected as a cultural monument since 1983.

Ljubljana's international airport is just south of town and is served by a regular bus service.

The city is 25km north-west from Ljubljana. There are 34 buses per day from Ljubljana.

There is a small train station. It is served by regular trains running between Ljubljana and Jesenice (connecting to Villach, Austria), which run approximately every 4 hours.

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The Management in Sport BA study programme (professionally oriented higher education) consists of three years (6 semesters). An individual year is evaluated with 60 ECTS credit points, so that the entire programme consists of 180 ECTS credit points.

The programme consists of obligatory courses, elective courses, practical training and the final paper.

Students enrolled in the 1st year of the programme have 6 obligatory courses:

- PROFESSIONAL TERMINOLOGY IN ENGLISH
- KINESIOLOGY
- MANAGEMENT IN SPORT
- INFORMATION SYSTEMS IN SPORTS
- PSYCHOLOGY
- PROJECT MANAGEMENT IN SPORTS

In the 2nd year, students have 5 obligatory courses:

- ECONOMICS, ACCOUNTING AND FINANCES IN SPORTS
- HUMAN RESOURCE MANAGEMENT
- ORGANIZATIONAL AND LEGAL ASPECTS OF SPORTS
- MARKETING
- MANAGEMENT OF SPORTS EVENTS AND FACILITIES

and 1 elective course, which can be selected from a list of 3 courses.

In the 3rd year, students have 3 obligatory courses:

- PUBLIC RELATIONS
- LOGISTICS IN SPORTS
- ATHLETE NUTRITION

and 1 elective course, which can be selected from a list of 2 courses, as well as practical training.

They finish the programme with a final paper.

From 50% to 100% of the courses will be carried out remotely (methods and organizational forms of studies will be flexible, which means that student athletes will be able to study along with their sports career. Because of this, a large part of studies will be carried out online. For the courses with a required face-to-face teaching method (such as accounting, etc.), learning content will be supplied with the possibility of active participation of the participants in the education process).

During their studies, the students of the Management in Sport BA study programme (professionally oriented higher education) obtain informative and formative knowledge and are trained to carry out functions of the management process and fundamental and support business functions under the subject-specific competencies.

The functions of the management process include planning, organizing, leading, monitoring and motivating personnel. The fundamental business functions include purchasing, marketing, human resources management, finance and accounting, etc. Support business functions include informatics, public relations, ensuring security service and others.

The graduates are capable of operative control of management, marketing, accounting and finance. They perform operative work in the field of sports – organization and projects, The conversion business function relates to sports to management of sports infrastructure, sports organizations, sports facilities and sports as a purely commercial service.

The environment of the institution where the study programme will be carried out will have a significant impact on the achievement of graduate competencies.

The students will have the option of performing practical training in organizations organizing the largest sports events in Faculty vicinity: Planica, Kranjska gora, Bled and Pokljuka.

In the Kranj area, there is infrastructure that allows for organization of sports competition at the level of the World and the European championships: Planica Nordic Centre, ski slope in Kranjska Gora, rowing centre in Bled, sports hall in Jesenice, biathlon centre in Pokljuka, swimming pool in Kranj, airport in Lesce, athletic stadiums in Bled, Radovljica and Kranj, ski jumping hills in Kranj, football centre in Brdo, etc.

In the local area, there are sports clubs for traditional sports disciplines that brought the biggest successes in Slovenian sport, including medals at the Olympics, World, and European championships: alpine skiing, Nordic skiing, biathlon, swimming, ice hockey, sky diving, rowing, athletics, water polo, etc.

Faculty of Organizational Sciences is higher education institution, part of University of Maribor, which deals with education, scientific research and consultancy through development of knowledge and skills in management, information system and technology with aim to enable future professionals to develop potentials of commerce and society.

The best indicator of good work at the Faculty is employability of graduates. The faculty graduates (more than 19,000 since faculty was established, including 122 PhDs) can be found in the most responsible managerial positions in the government, public administration, economy, education, health care and among the most successful Slovenian entrepreneurs.

Faculty of Organizational Sciences provides the best conditions for educational activities with the help of computer equipment. This includes a modern network (the Faculty building has a local wired and wireless network).

The wired local area network is universal and structured, built on the basis of category 5 UTP cables and optical fibres. The network provides 450 connections. The Ethernet-type wired star network provides transfer speeds of 100/1000 Mbps. The local area network is externally connected through an access point in the Faculty building. The data transfer rate is 1 Gbps. For all students and staff, a wireless Eduroam network is available in the faculty building.

The Faculty library provides access to study literature to teachers, students and other external users through borrowing or use on library premises. The size of the library is 313 square meters. It has a library fund of 41,306 book units. All materials in the library are freely accessible and can be browsed and selected by the students themselves, with the exception of CDs, video tapes, reading copies of textbooks and archival material. Such material is accessible upon arrangement with the librarian.

Accommodation: Many students are staying at the University Halls of Residence.
